Greetings

The AEON 1% Club Foundation, which was launched in 1989 along with the new corporate group name of "AEON", has from our establishment until today cooperated with a diverse range of the AEON group companies including retail, finance, developer business, based on AEON's desire to utilize the profits we receive from our customers for the benefit of society. We have utilized the qualities of our shopping centers that are visited by large numbers of customers every day in order to tackle social contribution activities together with our customers.

The Foundation, which transitioned into a public interest incorporated foundation in 2015, aims to further reinforce our three main project themes: Sound Development of the Next Generation, Promotion of Friendship with Foreign Countries, and Sustainable Development of Regional Communities.

Last year, we held our 30th Anniversary Project, with the title "Sustainable 2050 : What We Can Do Towards the Realization of a Sustainable Society". At this event, 331 successive participants of the "Teenage Ambassadors" program from 18 countries renewed old friendships, and jointly formulated their own Declaration of Action.

In a time when anxieties about the sustainability of the global environment and social fragmentation are increasing around the world, young people in their teens and twenties are directly seeking action from international society and respective national governments, and movements to promote policy shift are spreading. In addition, recovery and reconstruction efforts due to the serial outbreak of natural disasters have become part of normal life, and the ideal form of "mutual aid" in local regions is being reconsidered.

As we enter the new decade of the 2020s, the Foundation will take this opportunity to return to our roots at the time of our establishment. We will strive to contribute to the promotion of international friendship, mutual understanding and the cultivation of human talent who will form the core of society in the middle of this century.

History of the Foundation

The AEON 1% Club Foundation was established at the proposal of Takuya Okada, then Representative Director and Chairman of JUSCO Co. Ltd. in 1989, at a time when corporate social contribution activities remained largely undeveloped in Japan.

On the occasion of JUSCO's 20th anniversary year, the aim was to embody the newly-formed AEON Group's basic principles of pursuing peace, respecting humanity, and contributing to local communities, and to fulfill our social responsibilities as a constantly innovating corporate group.

In order to consistently carry out such activities regardless of corporate performance, it was determined that each of the major AEON Group companies would donate 1% of their pre-tax profits to the Foundation, and the themes of the Foundation's projects were set out as Environmental Protection, International Cultural and Interpersonal Exchange, and Regional Cultures and Social Development.

The roots of the social contribution activities tackled in these projects can be traced back to the era of Okadaya, one of AEON's forerunners as a company. In 1958, Okadaya organized a scholarship society named Fujukai* for children orphaned by traffic accidents, and awarded a scholarship stipend equivalent to a month's tuition fees to five high school students every month. Affiliate companies subsequently continued this activity, and it became a key point in the inception of the AEON Group's corporate culture, in the sense of starting off first with what can be accomplished regardless of the scale of the company.

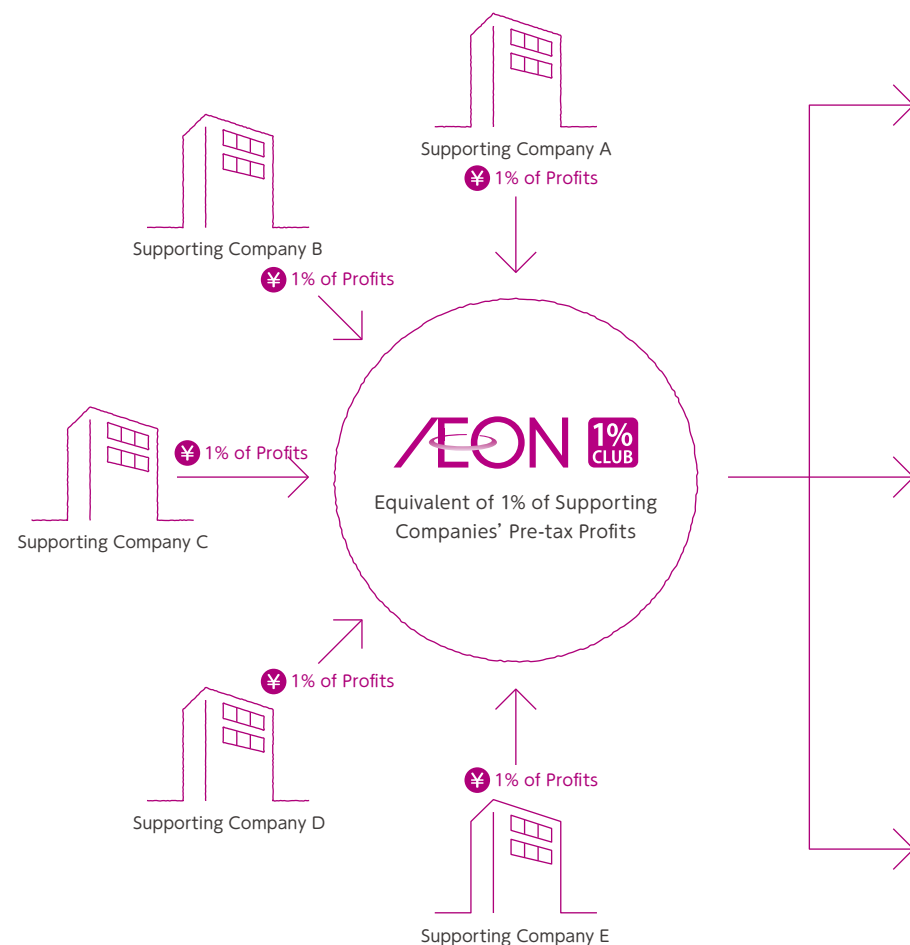
Fujukai was named after a traditional Chinese proverb, "The Grief of the Swaying Tree", which expresses the grieving of children who have lost their parents. In 2017, Fujukai was revived as an allowance-based scholarship system by the Okada Cultural Foundation, of which Takuya Okada serves as Chairman, and provides support for the school expenses of high school students aiming to enter university.

The major AEON Group companies donate 1% of their pre-tax profits, and the Foundation engages in projects with three main themes: Sound Development of the Next Generation, Promotion of Friendship with Foreign Countries, and Sustainable Development of Regional Communities.

Sound Development of the Next Generation (P.05~P.14)

The Foundation cultivates children's abilities to think about environmental issues while learning about societal rules, via activities such as environmental study and team presentations of environmental initiative case studies. Furthermore, we support the building of new schools in countries that lack sufficient educational facilities, through coordination with national governments and NPOs.



Promotion of Friendship with Foreign Countries (P.15~P.22)

We provide students with opportunities for international cultural and interpersonal exchange, and strengthen the bonds of friendship between Japan and various countries by deepening mutual understanding. In addition, we support the development of internationally-minded citizens through actions such as awarding scholarships to foreign students in Japan.



Sustainable Development of Regional Communities (P.23~P.30)

The Foundation supports the transmission of traditional events and culture firmly rooted in local regions, which needs to be passed down to the next generations, as well as providing support for the revival and reconstruction of regions damaged by large-scale natural disasters. We also work to foster new talent who will shoulder the responsibilities of such activities.

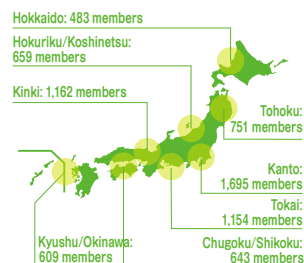

Thinking and Learning on Environmental Themes

The AEON Cheers Club provides opportunities, based at 453 locations nationwide, for children from first grade of elementary school to third grade of junior high school to learn about rules and manner through group activities, while cultivating their interest, awareness and ability to think about the environment, through carrying out hands-on activities. The club was started in 1996, initially inspired by the Foundation's support for the Junior Eco Club, a project of the Ministry of the Environment. In fiscal year 2020, which marks the fifteenth anniversary of the change in name to the "AEON Cheers Club", the club will aim towards activities that are based on regional characteristics, by revising the activity themes which have so far been established for each fiscal year, and by each individual club selecting its own specific theme related to the environment and society.

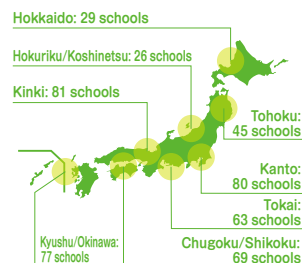
Expand the Sphere of Eco-Activities

Expressing Gratitude to Those Important to Us

On the theme of "Food", which fosters a healthy body and mind and rich human characteristics, the Foundation holds the Junior High School Students' Essay Contest, where participants express their gratitude to important people in their lives for memorable meals or dishes through their essays. Aimed at junior high school students nationwide, we endeavor to promote dietary education by celebrating and widely circulating outstanding entries. In continuation from last year's contest, entries were received on the theme of "The People who are Important to Us, and Saying 'Thank You': Memorable Dishes and Gratitude for Meals", totaling 2,140 essays received in fiscal year 2019. The Gold Prize-winning contestants participated in a hands-on experience of traditional dietary culture in Gunma Prefecture, which became an opportunity to deepen their understanding of dietary education.

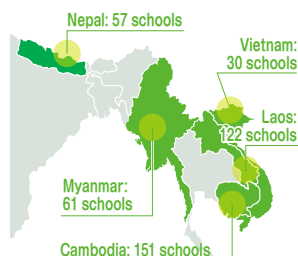

Providing Learning Spaces for Children in Asia

Based on the principle that basic education is indispensable for the realization of a peaceful society, since 2000 the Foundation has been supporting the building of schools in five Asian countries in which educational facilities are underdeveloped. We have utilized donations made by AEON customers nationwide, as well as the AEON 1% Club's contributions, to complete the construction of 421 schools so far. This involves soft aspects, such as the provision of water supply systems and training of teaching staff, in addition to constructing school buildings.

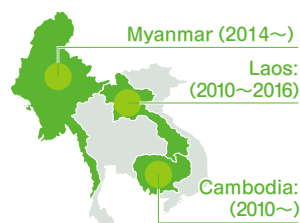

Providing Safe Water for Children in Asia

In some parts of Cambodia, Laos and Myanmar, it is difficult to ensure hygienic water supply, and unhygienic pond water or groundwater which contains substances that may be hazardous to health is used as domestic water. In addition, many children are unable to attend school as their time is consumed by fetching water from far distances. The AEON UNICEF Safe Water Campaign was started in 2010 to support such children in both health and educational aspects. Through the Japan Committee for UNICEF, donations from AEON customers and the AEON 1% Club's contributions play a valuable part in the provision of safe water and construction of water supply facilities.

Circle of Friendship Linking Asian Countries

The Teenage Ambassadors Program is an exchange program in which high school students from Japan and other countries visit each other's countries and strengthen international mutual understanding and friendship. Young people of the same generation yet with differing cultures, traditions and lifestyles, interact via three activities: Ambassador Activity, Exchange Activity, and History & Culture Activity. This program has been held annually since 1990, with a cumulative total of 18 countries including Japan and 2,810 participants. In 2019, which marked the thirtieth anniversary of the Foundation's establishment, a commemorative event was held. The program was attended by a large number of participants, including former Teenage Ambassadors, and provided opportunities for reflection on the program's progress over the last thirty years, as well as for the broadening of inter-generational circles of friendship.

Japan-China Teenage Ambassadors

The Teenage Ambassadors program with China received high acclaim from the Government of Beijing Municipality, as well as from participating students from both countries, for the exchange held with the City of Beijing in 2009. Since then, in partnership with bodies including China's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Government of Beijing Municipality and the Chinese Embassy in Japan, the program has been held every year with the aim of contributing to further enhanced friendly relations between Japan and China, and has extended its area of exchange to include other areas. A total of 1,411 high school students from Japan and China have established bonds of friendship as Teenage Ambassadors so far. In 2020, exchanges will be conducted with Beijing and Suzhou.

The program has been officially recognized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs as an event to commemorate the Japan-China Culture and Sports Exchange Promotion Year.

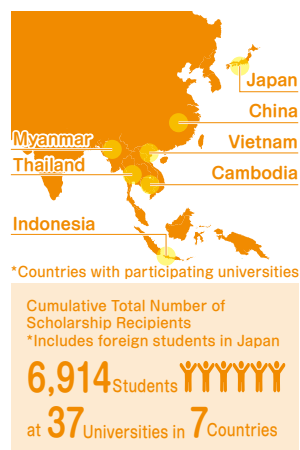

Hoping for Recovery and Enhanced Development of Disaster-Related Areas

The Foundation provides support for disaster relief and reconstruction so that people affected by large-scale natural disasters can resume their normal daily lives as quickly as possible. Furthermore, looking toward the future, we engage in initiatives to support enhanced development in areas affected by the Great East Japan Earthquake.

Forest Spirit Healing Project for Children in Fukushima

Since the Great East Japan Earthquake, there have been concerns that the children of Fukushima Prefecture do not have enough access to outdoor play or experiences of nature. The Foundation invites such children to Afan Woodland in Kurohime, Shinano town, Nagano Prefecture, and to Shinano town itself, which is renowned as a prominent region in the field of forest therapy. The program provides children with opportunities to be physically active and develop a sense of familiarity with nature.

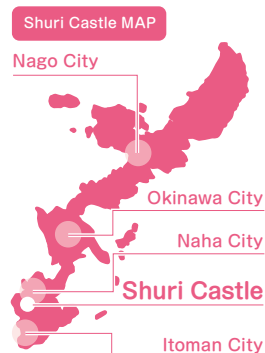

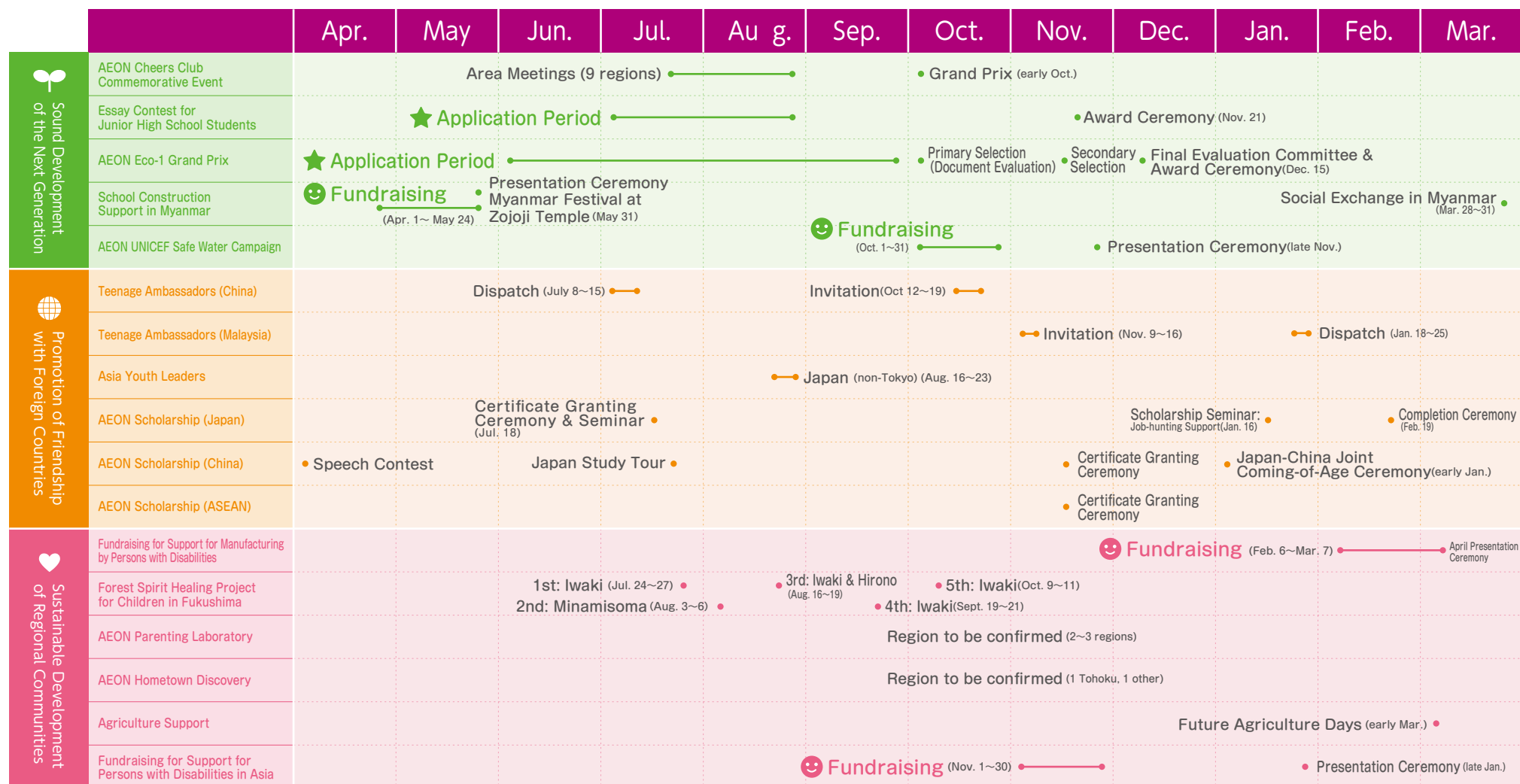
