Thank you very much for your understanding and support of our foundation's activities. The AEON 1% Club was founded in 1990 through the participation of each of the AEON Group's companies with the aim of transferring our basic principles to specific actions and fulfilling our social responsibilities "by pursuing peace, respecting humans, and contributing to local communities with customers as the starting point."

For over 30 years, we have been working hard on environmental and social contributions on the pillars of "healthy development of children," "friendships with other countries," and "local development contributions" through the equivalent of 1% of profits that are generated thanks to customers choosing the AEON Group.

Rising societal tensions from the spread of Covid infections and the situation in Ukraine have led to a steep increase in the cost of resources due to damaged supply chains and so on, which has had an impact on all nations' economies and people's lives. In order to build a peaceful and sustainable society where everyone can live with a sense of security, it is necessary to take greater action. The AEON 1% Club is crossing borders between countries and organizations to have dialogue and cooperate with people from various standpoints.

In 2023, we will position the "AEON Cheers Club," which carries out experiential learning at stores in each region about nature and the environment for mainly elementary school students, as an important project and pour our efforts into the development of new activity programs where children can learn spontaneously about the environment.

I would also like for us to carry out projects in line with events that will become turning points, such as the 50th anniversary of diplomatic relations between Japan and Vietnam, as well as improve our external communication skills and develop our business.

Our foundation will continue to aim for a future full of happiness, healthy development of children, friendships with other countries, and contributions to local development.

Founding history

The "AEON Group 1% Club" was founded in 1990 at the proposal of Takuya Okada, then Representative Director and Chairman of Jusco Co. Ltd., when social contribution activities from companies in Japan still weren't up to speed. On the occasion of Jusco's 20th anniversary, our aim was to fulfill our social responsibilities and realize the basic principles of the newly-formed AEON Group of "pursuing peace, respecting humans, and contributing to regional communities as a corporate group that always seeks to innovate."

In order to continue with our activities, it was decided that each of the group's main companies would donate 1% of their pre-tax profits to the foundation, regardless of business performance, and the pillars of the foundation were laid out as "environmental preservation, international culture, personnel exchange, development of talent, and promotion of local cultures and society."

The origin of our engagement in social contribution activities at each business traces back to the era of Okadaya, one of AEON's forerunners. In 1958, Okadaya organized a scholarship society for orphans of traffic accidents named "Fujyukai" after a famous Chinese proverb, "Fujyunotan," which expresses regret for not appreciating one's parents when they were alive. Every month, he provided the funds equivalent to one month's tuition fees to five high school students as stipends. This activity was taken on by subsequent affiliate companies and led to the cultivation of a company culture of "starting from where you can," regardless of the scale of the company.

In 2017, Fujyukai was revived as an allowance-based scholarship system by the Okada Cultural Foundation, where Takuya Okada serves as chairman, and supports the school expenses of high school students aiming to enter university.

AEON Cheers Club

Elementary students

We conduct experiential learning for elementary and middle school students at a total of 400 stores as places to hold an interest in nature and the environment and to cultivate the ability to think. Each club has its activities implemented in accordance with unique themes related to "environment and society," and annual achievements are put together on wall newspapers. Presentation competitions for wall newspapers are held in nine areas every year from February to March, and the winning club is entered into the national competition.

Activities Planned for FY2023

We will open Cheers Farms as places to experience farmwork, such as harvesting crops. We are also planning to continue from last year by holding financial education events where pupils can enjoy learning about money.

In September 2022, the new AEON Cheers Club Welcia Tsukuba initiated activities in cooperation with the 22 Welcia Pharmacy stores in the city of Tsukuba, Ibaraki Prefecture.

Rice Harvesting Experience and Making Medicinal Curry

After experiencing rice harvesting using a sickle, pupils learned about the nutrients contained in rice. They also had an opportunity to make "medicinal curry" using the rice that had been cooked in an earthenware pot.





Children's Pharmacist Experience

Pupils learned about working as a pharmacist at the Welcia Dispensing Pharmacy. After changing into some white coats, they had a go at packaging medicines made of sweets.





Carrot Harvesting Experience

At a farm in the city of Tsukuba, pupils learned about things like the many nutrients contained in carrots and, following this, experienced harvesting carrots.





Making Wall Newspapers

At the AEON Mall in Tsukuba, pupils learned about things such as how to write articles. After this, they put together all of their activities onto imitation Japanese vellum, created wall newspapers, and then presented them as a team in front of their families.



■Waku Waku Cashless Experience

In February 2023, a cashless payment experience was held at the AEON Mall Fukuoka and was attended by local children and AEON Cheers Club members. The activity aims to allow children to learn firsthand about the advantages of cashless shopping under the cooperation of AEON Financial Service Co., Ltd. and this was the second time it has been held since the initial event in August 2022.

Learning about the Advantages of Cashless

Pupils learned about the convenient aspects of cashless, such as not needing to carry a wallet or purse, the hygiene of not having to directly touch coins and bills, and how cashless is a friendly method of payment for people and the environment since it can reduce the costs involved in the production of coins and bills and reduce the need for transport and distribution.

Junior High School Writing Competition Middle School Students

Since 2003, we have been carrying out competitions that aim to have junior high school students consolidate their own thoughts about the theme of social issues and develop their writing abilities. The ten gold winners are invited to a nutrition education tour held in Tokyo over two days and one night. In 2022, we invited compositions themed on "Global Warming Considerations from Food." We received many individual works from all over the country written about specific initiatives, such as reducing food loss and local production for local consumption. At the "nutrition education tour," the coexistence of city and nature was observed at the "rooftop bee yard" that is installed on a building in the city center. Following this, a discussion and presentations were made on menus for school meals that consider the environment.

We will invite compositions themed on the "environment." We are planning to have the winners participate in an eco-tour.



AEON Eco-1 Grand Prix High school students

High school students present their environmental activities that they are regularly working on. The event, which has been running since 2012, aims to allow students to seize opportunities for new actions and improve their ability to express and convey themselves by listening to presentations from other schools. In the 11th "AEON Eco-1 Grand Prix," the 12 schools that passed the second round of judging entered the final round held in Tokyo. All of the high schools were very enthusiastic about confronting environmental issues, and the presentations conveyed the image of everyone working hard to resolve regional issues. The judging resulted in awards for six schools, including the Prime Minister's Award ("Dissemination and Enlightenment Division" and "Research and Specialized Division"), the Minister of the Environment Award, the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology Award, the AEON 1% Club Award, and the Judges' Special Award respectively. Honorable certificates and activity incentives were also awarded.

School Construction Support Project







Since 2000, we have been supporting the construction of schools in five Asian countries where the development of educational facilities is lagging behind, with the thought that "Improving basic education is vital for realizing a peaceful society." We utilize donations received from all over the country and from AEON 1% Club contributions, and to date we have completed 426 schools in Cambodia, Nepal, Laos, Vietnam, and Myanmar. Aside from building school buildings, installing water supply facilities, and supplying school supplies, we also provide support such as teacher training.

Activities Planned for FY2023

We plan to support the construction of schools and implement teacher training in Southeast Asia.

In some regions of Cambodia, Laos, and Myanmar, it takes time to fetch water from far away, and there are children who are unable to study at school. It is also difficult to ensure sanitary water, so unsanitary pond water or underground water that contains harmful substances that may damage health is used as water in everyday life. Since 2010, the donations received from all over the country and the contributions from the AEON 1% Club have helped to establish the provision of safe water and water supplies, as well as supporting such children on both sides of education and health via the Japan Committee for UNICEF.

Teenage Ambassadors High school students

This is an exchange program that sees Japanese and overseas high school students pairing up, visiting one another's countries, and deepening international mutual understanding and friendships. The young people from the same generation, who have different cultures, traditions, and lifestyle customs, interact through three activities: "Courtesy Visits", "Exchange Activities," and "History and Culture Activities." The project has been running every year since 1990, and so far 2,421 people have participated from 18 countries, including Japan.

Activities Planned for FY2023

On the occasion of Japan and Vietnam reaching their 50th anniversary of diplomatic relations, we plan to carry out activities and hold a mutual exchange in Japan in November and in Vietnam (both Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh City) in January 2024.

This is a program themed on social issues, with high school students from Asian countries using English as a common language to hold various discussions and propose solutions for issues based on observation and lectures from specialists. The aim is to provide a space to students where they can deepen their understanding and broaden their horizons toward different ways of thinking and opinions with eight countries that have a different sense of values, including Indonesia, Cambodia, Thailand, China, Japan, Vietnam, Malaysia, and Laos, as well as develop the next generation of leaders. 
Emergency Disaster Recovery Support for Victims of Southeast Turkey Earthquake

On February 14, 2023, we handed over emergency support funds of 10 million yen to Ambassador Korkut Gungen at the Turkish Embassy in Japan for the victims of the earthquake in southeastern Turkey. On that occasion, we heard that the reconstruction and recovery were taking time, and many people were forced to seek refuge in severely cold conditions.

Hence, we revisited the Turkish Embassy in Japan on March 10 to inform them that we would be donating 6,000 blankets and 2,000 sleeping bags. These relief supplies were transported by air from Haneda Airport to Turkey and are being put to use by the victims.

Shuri Castle Reconstruction Support Project

In order to support the reconstruction of Shuri Castle from the serious damage it suffered in a fire at the end of October 2019, we announced that we would donate 500 million yen over a period of five years, so we are presenting Okinawa Prefecture with 100 million yen of support funds each year.

Along with repairs to the main temple building that began in the fall of 2022, a reconstruction memorial event that imitated the traditional event called "Kobikishiki" was held at the site, and the AEON 1% Club also participated.

In addition to the members from the AEON Cheers Club getting involved in the Okinawan traditional dance that was performed when the wood for the reconstruction was being transported, a woodworking experience workshop that reused wood from Shuri Castle was carried out, and an "AEON Cheers Club Shuri Castle Reconstruction Support Poster Competition" was held. The 169 prize-winning works of art were gathered from all over the country and exhibited, and an award ceremony was conducted in Shuri Castle Park.



Messages from Supporting Representatives

Our company is responsible for the developer business of the AEON Group, and focuses mainly on the development and operation of shopping malls. Under such a concept, we are working on "contributions to regional development," one of the pillars of business for the AEON 1% Club, through the preservation and

succession of unique local cultures that must be passed on to later generations. In 2022, we utilized the scale and strength of our malls to carry out approximately 40 local traditional events at approximately 20 malls, which created the opportunity to connect with many of our customers. Together with the AEON 1% Club, the AEON Group, and all of our stakeholders, we will grow again this year and endeavor to work hard on activities that contribute to society.

We are one of the core companies in the AEON Group and operate general supermarkets, such as AEON and AEON Style. We listen carefully to each of the regional communities and customer opinions, as well as work to create "community-based" stores. As part of this, we are proactive in the "AEON Cheers Club," an activity implemented by the AEON 1% Club that aims for healthy development for the next generation of children. The AEON 1% Club started the "Junior Eco-Club" activities in 1996, and has been carrying out an environmental learning and experience program as the "AEON Cheers Club" in regions since 2005. There are currently around 2,950 children registered at 300 of our stores, and employees at each of the stores support the activities in the respective regions. In 2022, we held our first online learning themed on "local food." Graduates are active in a whole host of specialist fields. From here on, we will continue to contribute to the development of local communities through activities based at our "AEON" and "AEON Style" stores together with the AEON 1% Club.
